Managers are meeting more frequently to consider the implications of the Ministerial Review and coordinate operational functions. A joint meeting with the Nelson Marlborough Council was attended with positive outcomes.

1927 Occupational Safety and Health

Completed staff H&S meetings and have incrementally been improving safety plans.

General maintenance including weed spraying, mowing and cleaning. The Lease for the Lake Kaniere Angling Club Bach has been presented to the angling club with debate around ownership and wording of a replacement lease.
