1311 Access

Access issues investigated on Crooked River and lower Grey. Upper Crooked River access continues to be difficult for visiting anglers. Lower Grey access issue appears to be a confused angler, will improve signage to avoid this reoccurring.

Relevant material been posted on website. Regular Facebook articles produced, focusing on promoting the Summer angling, fishing basics, compliance presence and family fishing.

1341 Sportsfisheries Guides

Checked and slightly edited for next print to ensure content still is relevant. Agents delivered copies in preparation for upcoming season.

1361 Clubs, Outdoor Recreation Groups

Ran weigh in at Lake Brunner fishing competition. The push from West Coast Fish & Game to have a longest fish competition and photograph trout on rulers resulted in two thirds of entered trout being released. Fishing basics course ran in conjunction with the competition and attended by approximately 20 anglers. Fly fishing basics course ran in Ikamatua, attended by five anglers which was ideal given complexity of fly casting.

1421 Media/Communication

Articles being released shortly promoting summer trout fishing and salmon angling.

1431 Political Advocacy

A short introductory meeting was held with the Minister of Conservation. Topics discussed were native and introduced fish interactions, Fish and Game's role and our relationship with the DoC, Access and Whitebaiting regulation setting.

1511 Compliance

Compliance undertaken over the Christmas break, fine weather and around long weeks/holiday periods. No offences detected.

1521 Ranger Training

Bruce Hitchens has completed an honorary ranger application. Police vetting and referee checks have been completed with no issues identified thus far. Needs to spend time in field with staff to further assess his suitability.

1531 Prosecutions

Diversions completed by anglers FWL at Lake Brunner and Ahaura.

1621 Agent Liaison

Liaison continues regarding the start of the season and responding to angler enquiries.

1841 National Liaison

Managers are meeting more frequently via internet meetings with the rapidly changing financial and regulatory environment. Promotion of the new fishing season have been a focus.

1927 Occupational Safety and Health

Completed staff H&S meetings and currently reviewing the workplan with a focus on the safety of operations.
