MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE WELLINGTON FISH & GAME COUNCIL, HELD ON WEDNESDAY 21 AUGUST 2013 AT 3.00PM AT HOTEL COACHMAN 140 FITZHERBERT AVE, PALMERSTON NORTH.

1. Present:

4. <u>Conflicts of Interest</u>

A list was available for viewing of the existing declarations of Conflicts of Interest. There was no additional declaration of Conflicts of Interests declared.

5. <u>Minutes of Previous Meeting of 18 June 2013:</u>

After a brief discussion it was moved that: the Minutes of the last meeting of the previous Wellington Fish & Game Council of 18 June 2013 be approved as a true and correct record of the proceedings of that meeting.

6. <u>Matters Arising</u>

Mr Teal confirmed that the Licence Fee Recommendation to the Minister had been approved and drew Council's attention to the letter from the Minister informing NZ Council of this and reasons for delay in making the decision.

Mr Teal noted that Southland F&G had withdrawn its initiative to require nontoxic shot for sub-12 gauge for the upcoming season, although would review their position in the future. It was confirmed that Wellington F&G preferred the status quo of providing an exemption for use of non-toxic shot for shotguns less than 12gauge.

7. <u>NZ Council Business</u>

Councillor Morris gave an overview of the NZ Council Meeting held on 19 to 21 July 2013.

Councillor Morris noted that §5.4 of the Minutes of that meeting recorded how NZ Council were dealing with historical internal organisational issues, and their intention to better define the roles of CE and governors.

Councillor Morris outlined the proposal of NZ Council to hold a meeting in November to focus strategic direction, involving NZ Council, managers, and regional F&G Chairmen.

Councillor Morris referred to NZ Council's intention to get an independent economic and environmental review of the Lake Opuha water storage project. Councillor Cotsilinis also sought verification of accounts of potential impacts of reduced flushing effects and build up of sludge,

Councillor Morris referred to a correspondence from Federation of Freshwater Anglers that sought consideration of an option for licenceholders to vote for each Council member to the NZ Council, rather than current situation of appointees being elected by regional Council members only.

Councillor Morris noted that there were some interesting fieldtrips conducted around Taranaki region as part of the NZ Council proceedings, which showed good examples of riparian planting which may benefit water quality.

Councillor Morris confirmed that Andy Tannock had been nominated by NZ F&GC to the Minister of Conservation for a position on the Game Bird Habitat Trust Board. Acclamation.

8. <u>Lake Wairarapa Update:</u>

Mr Teal confirmed that Fish & Game had been afforded observer status at the Wairarapa Moana Management Group meetings.

There was brief discussion on the overview provided by Nic Cudby for the Yules Lagoon project and agreed that staff continue to progress the project.

A proposal from Greater Wellington Regional Council (on behalf of Wairarapa Moana was discussed that involved the removal of exotic fish (including sports fish) from Barton's Lagoon. It was agreed that a letter be sent outlining Council's views:

- The process and methods by which which trout are removed is agreed;
- Fish & Game would prefer netting of fish and do not consider poisoning appropriate;
- Fish & Game's support of this proposal on this site does not confer support for ongoing fish removal from any other sites in the Wairarapa Moana area these will be considered on a case by case basis;
- Any publicity surrounding fish removal will be undertaken in a sensitive manner and mutually agreed prior to release;
- Confirmation is sought that flood frequency and intensity are not insurmountable factors for this site;
- The statutory responsibilities of Fish & Game and other parties are recognised;
- Fish & Game are considering this as a stand alone proposal, not a trial for wider programmes;
- Fish & Game is provided with methodology to review prior to field studies, and that this methodology is considered acceptable;
- Ensure that the data collected is representative;
- Results of raw data of what is caught is provided in a timely manner to Fish & Game;
- Fish & Game wish to have the option of having an observer present during any field work; to assist and observe;
- The desired responses should be objective and not presumptuous.

9. <u>Resource Management Overview</u>

Mr Teal gave an overview of the resource management representation function of Fish & Game with particular reference to the regional planning process. He gave an overview of possible ways of undertaking the function in a more consistent and efficient manner. It was agreed that a letter be sent to NZ Council outlining the issues and possible solutions for Fish & Game's engagement in future RM cases.

10. Draft Annual Plan 2013/14:

The Draft Annual Plan was briefly discussed noting the licence fee recommendations had been approved. It was noted that Councillor Moore's residence was now Kapiti Coast rather than Upper Hutt.

Proposals for Additional Fishing Licence Categories: Discussion focused on a document prepared by a F&G Working Party on the potential licence options proposed and possible implementation strategy. A level of comfort with the proposed categories was given by Council:

Mr Teal gave an overview of the report prepared by Nic Cudby on the Regional Hunter Survey conducted as part of the National Gamebird Harvest Survey.

Brief discussion occurred on the question relating to use of sub-12 gauge shotguns on opening weekend and the use of non-toxic shot. Councillor Tannock noted that an education initiative was being planned for southern NZ, relating to the efficacy of smaller shot size on shotgun patterns.

Mr Teal gave a brief update on the mallard research indicating that the proposed PhD student had withdrawn from the proposed telemetry study. The study was however still proceeding with some additional staffing for the first year while alternative project options are canvassed.

Mr Teal gave a brief overview of the project and initiatives being investigated including: educational initiatives ("Fish in Schools" and "Water Means Life", recreational initiatives (Wairarapa Kids Outdoor Expo, School Participation Recreation Module), and fish-out opportunities and follow-up.
