1111 Drift Diving

Dives have been completed at Mawheraiti River (SH6 and Mirfins bridges, Grey River (upper Grey and Waipuna), Inangahua River @ Blacks point, Upper Larry's Creek site and Lower Waitahu site. completed. The results from the upstream site on the Mawheraiti were similar to the long-term average every other site has been above average large due high numbers of small fish.

1113 Spawning Surveys

Inquires made into potential salmon spawning activity in the Buller River, no information obtained.

1114 Trend Counts

Paradise Shelduck Counts underway.

1115 Sportsfishery Research

Communication with WCRC regarding research sites monitoring and Fish & Game aiding with Lake monitoring work. Mawheraiti sites fished in late January, numbers good despite reduced presence of macro invertebrates and change to river stream beds contributed to the December flooding. New River sites currently scheduled to be fished on 28/01/22.

1361 Clubs, Outdoor Recreation Groups

Aiding with Lake Brunner fishing competition and doing a family skills and information session to upskill anglers. Ran weigh in at Lake Brunner fishing competition, only 58 entries with very poor weather but event has improved on previous years at the request of Fish & Game. Every child got a prize and certificate, with the event having a family focus and celebrating participation in the sport. Another positive being very few fish were killed, with many anglers utilising the photograph entry method and only killing a trout if was destined for the table. A family skills and information session was ran also, attended by 10 anglers despite wet weather.
