
#### Cat

#### How do we control Predators?

Unfortunately we are unable to protect ducks from all predators, but we can target two of them – rats and stoats.

This is a DOC 200 trap. It has a tunnel system so that weka can't stretch in and get the egg that is used for bait.

These traps have to be checked regularly and the predators removed from them so they can be reset and ready to use again.

You will need an adult to help you set one of these traps as they are very strong.

This is a Good Nature Trap. What is different about this trap from the DOC 200, is it is able to kill up to 24 stoats or rats before it needs human attention. This is done by a canister of CO<sub>2</sub> which is used to power a rod that is activated when the stoat or rat puts its head up into the device. It will re-load itself ready for the next predator.
